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flavoured milk, poppers, frozen yoghurt, icy poles and slushies. All items need to be pre-ordered (including frozen items).

Those parents who have volunteered in the canteen throughout the year have done an excellent job and the students and staff have greatly appreciated the support they have given to everyone in the school.


BAND TOUR
