A few important notices

Naplan

NAPLAN is a national literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake. The NAPLAN test window starts on Wednesday 15 March and finishes on Monday 27 March 2023. Information brochures have been sent home to all year 3 and 5 families. Our year 3 and 5 students have been practicing during school to ensure they understand how to work under test conditions.

Student attendance

Student Attendance continues to be a focus our aim is to have 85% of students attending 90% or more of the time. So far this year we have 53% of students attending school 90% or more of the time. Please make sure your child attends school every day they can. Missing a day here or there may not seem like much, but absences add up and can impact your child's learning more than you think. Late arrivals and early departures are also an impact on your child's learning. When your child misses one day a week over a year, that's 40 days of school, 8 weeks of lessons and 2.5 years over their school life lost.

Unexplained absences are marked as unjustified. Please call or return the explained absence slip t your teacher upon return to school to explain your child's absence. If you are absent for three days or more you are required to have a medical certificate to justify the reason for absence.
